




COMMODORE ATUL KUMAR RASTOGI DDG NCC DTE VISIT TO



- Promote India's leadership role in international diplomacy and development


The students marched with energy and enthusiasm, displaying banners and slogans related to the G-20 theme. The rally showcased the spirit of informed activism among the participants.

CONCLUSION







CONCLUSION




